Subject Access - Section 7, Data Protection Act 1998

The Data Protection Act places an obligation on the Police when holding personal information to provide a copy of that information (unless an exemption applies) to the individual concerned on request.

From the personal details supplied in your request, please find enclosed the information that the Chief Constable is required to supply under the provisions of the Act.

Information which can identify a third party may have been deleted from your disclosure and any information deleted for this reason has been replaced by a series of dots.

If you have requested information which may be held on a local police system, that will be returned to you under separate cover by the appropriate police force. ACRO does not have access to information held on local police systems.

The ACRO Criminal Records Office (ACRO) provides a Subject Access service on behalf of the majority of UK police forces for information held on the Police National Computer (PNC). However, the information contained on PNC is owned and processed by the individual force that entered it onto the system. The Chief Constable of each police force entering personal data on PNC is the Data Controller as governed by the Data Protection Act 1998. ACRO cannot amend or delete information held on PNC. To query or object to the content or processing of your personal data contained on PNC you will need to contact the relevant police force(s) that entered your details. You should be able to identify the relevant police force(s) from the enclosed PNC report.
