
Subject Access – Section 45, Data Protection Act 2018

The Data Protection Act places an obligation on the police when holding personal data to provide a copy of that data to the individual concerned on request, unless an exemption applies. From the personal details supplied in your request, please find enclosed the data that the chief constable is required to supply under the provisions of the Act. Your disclosure is for personal use only – you are NOT obligated to provide this to a third party.

Information held that can identify a third party may have been deleted from your disclosure. Any information deleted for this reason is replaced by a series of dots.

ACRO Criminal Records Office provides a subject access disclosure service on behalf of the majority of UK police forces for data held on the Police National Computer (PNC). Information relating to firearms certificate holders is also recorded on the PNC. The data contained on the PNC is owned and processed by the individual police force that entered it onto the system. The chief constable of each police force entering personal data on the PNC is the Data Controller as governed by the Data Protection Act 2018. ACRO cannot amend or delete data held on the PNC. To query or object to the content or processing of your personal data contained on the PNC, you will need to contact the relevant police force(s). You should be able to identify the relevant police force(s) from the enclosed PNC report. ACRO does not have access to information held on local police systems.
